Investment Philosophy

WBI Investments, Inc. ("WBI") builds separately managed account (SMA) strategies with the goal of providing the investment outcome clients require at the level of risk they are willing to assume. While many investment managers attempt to perform well relative to a fluctuating market index or benchmark, WBI's risk-managed investment solutions have the goal of providing consistent, attractive returns with less volatility and risk to capital than traditional approaches, whatever market conditions may be.

Composite Description

The **WBI BullBear Trend Switch US 2000 Bond** strategy seeks long-term capital appreciation, with the potential for current income, while also seeking to protect principal during unfavorable market conditions. The **WBI BullBear Trend Switch US 2000 Bond** strategy invests in equity securities or ETFs that WBI believes offer the potential for a high correlation to the performance of the broader U.S. small- and mid-capitalization equities market when market conditions are considered favorable by WBI. WBI uses a rules-based methodology analyzing macro-economic factors and technical market trends including, among others, those relating to commodities, monetary policy, valuation, sentiment and change in interest rates, to assess risk and determine whether market conditions are favorable or unfavorable. When conditions in the equity market are considered unfavorable by WBI, the portfolio will invest in U.S. fixed income securities or ETFs with exposure to U.S. fixed income securities. WBI uses a separate rules-based bond model that is run on a periodic basis and assesses conditions likely to affect the relative performance of selected segments of the fixed income market with respect to their sensitivity to credit quality and duration. The segments of the fixed income market evaluated are U.S. Treasuries, U.S. Investment Grade Corporate Bonds, and U.S. High Yield Bonds of both short and long durations. The intersection of the model's credit quality determination and its duration determination will indicate the recommended exposure for the portfolio during each period that will be implemented by WBI. The inception date of the investment strategy is October 2017 and the composite creation date is October 2017. The composite includes all discretionary accounts for which the client has selected the **WBI BullBear Trend Switch US 2000 Bond** strategy as the objective. Benchmark

The **WBI BullBear Trend Switch US 2000 Bond** strategy uses a quantitative management process in an attempt to optimize risk and return and meet the intended investment outcome of the strategy. Since the process used in the portfolio involves active risk management, no widely recognized benchmark is likely to be representative of the performance of any managed account. Therefore the benchmark is not, nor is it likely to become, representative of past or expected managed account holdings or performance. The historical performance results of the benchmark do not include the deduction of transaction and custodial charges, or the deduction of an investment management fee, which would likely alter indicated historical performance results.

The Russell 2000 Total Return Index has been selected as the benchmark shown for the **WBI BullBear Trend Switch US 2000 Bond** strategy since inception.

Verification

WBI claims compliance with the Global Investment Performance Standards (GIPS®) and has prepared and presented this report in compliance with the GIPS standards. WBI has been independently verified for the periods 12/31/1999 to 12/31/2020. A firm that claims compliance with the GIPS standards must establish policies and procedures for complying with all the applicable requirements of the GIPS standards. Verification provides assurance on whether the firm's policies and procedures related to composite and pooled fund maintenance, as well as the calculation, presentation, and distribution of performance, have been designed in compliance with the GIPS standards and have been implemented on a firm-wide basis. The **WBI BullBear Trend Switch US 2000 Bond** has had a performance examination for the periods 10/31/2017 to 12/31/2020. The verification and performance examination reports are available upon request.

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Definition of the Firm

WBI is an independent, privately owned investment management firm that is registered as an investment adviser with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) and provides discretionary investment management to individuals, pension and profit sharing plans, charitable organizations, corporations, and other entities.

Performance Calculations

Portfolio values are net of applicable taxes withheld by an account's custodian, but are otherwise pre-tax, and include realized and unrealized gains and losses plus income and returns from cash and cash equivalents. Performance is calculated in U.S. Dollars. The composite's time-weighted returns are calculated monthly by asset weighting its individual account members and are adjusted for external cash flows in excess of 10 percent of the value of the composite. Such flows result in the valuation of the composite on the day before the cash flow, and the computation of separate performance for the period up to and subsequent to that flow. Measures of internal composite dispersion are measured by the equal-weighted standard deviation of annual gross returns of those portfolios that are included in the composite for the full year. Only accounts in the composite for the full calendar year are included in dispersion calculations. The 2017 internal dispersion is not applicable because there are zero portfolios in the composite for the full year. The three-year annualized ex-post standard deviation of the composite and/or benchmark is not presented for periods where there are less than 36 months of composite returns. For reasons including variances in Portfolio account holdings, variances in the investment management fee incurred, market fluctuation, the date on which a client engaged WBI's investment management services, and account contributions or withdrawals, the performance of a client's account may vary from the indicated WBI composite performance results. Past performance may not be indicative of future results and the performance of an individual client account may vary from the composite performance results. Therefore, no current or prospective client should assume that future performance will be profitable, or equal either the WBI composite performance results reflected above, or the performance results of the benchmark. Fees

Gross of Fee Performance excludes the effects of WBI's investment management fee, third-party solicitor/advisor fees, custodial charges, and custodian platform charges, but is net of applicable account transaction charges and the separate fees assessed directly by each unaffiliated mutual fund holding (including ETFs) that was included in each Portfolio. Net of Fee Performance is net of the maximum WBI investment management fee only. Measures of internal composite dispersion, measured by the equal-weighted standard deviation of annual returns of those portfolios that are included in the composite for the full year, have also been adjusted to reflect this approach for all periods. This model fee approach consists of netting down 100 bps from gross returns on a monthly basis. Additional information about this change is available upon request. The actual, annual investment management fee rate charged shall vary (typically between 75 bps and 100 bps, but no more than 100 bps) depending upon the market value of assets under management and the specific type of investment management services to be rendered. Bundled Fees

A bundled fee is a fee that combines multiple fees into one total or "bundled" fee. Certain portfolios within each of the composites pay a bundled fee, which include charges for portfolio management, custody, other administrative fees, and may include trading costs. Composite assets that were assessed a bundled fee as-of year-end represent the following percentages of composite assets under management in each of the respective years listed:

Risk Characteristics and Standard Deviation

Three Year Annualized ex-post Standard Deviation (using monthly returns for each annual period for which 36 monthly returns are available) of both the Composite and Benchmark is shown as an external measure of risk. According to this measure, higher numbers denote greater risk during the given time period. Beta is a measure of volatility relative to a given index. A beta above 1 is more volatile than the index, while a beta below 1 is less volatile. Alpha is a measure of risk-adjusted performance. A positive Alpha indicates performance better than expected given the Beta (volatility) of the investment.
